ACE Eligibility Policy and Procedure

Purpose:

The Eligibility Policy and Procedure is developed to determine a Prospective Student's eligibility before enrolling in Funded Training.

Policy:

1. General Eligibility:

To be eligible for Funded Training, individuals must:

- (a) be aged 15 years or over.
- (b) no longer be enrolled in secondary school (home-school exception)
- (c) live or work in NSW (Exception A applies)
- (d) have a USI.
- (e) meet one of the following requirements:
 - □ be an Australian citizen.
 - Australian permanent resident
 - New Zealand citizen
 - meet Refugee or Humanitarian Visa requirements.
 - Eligible Asylum Seeker

Exception A: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who do not live or work in New South Wales but live in a specific defined interstate NSW border area are still eligible for training under the ACE Program. 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2. Specific eligibility criteria:

All students under the ACE Program must meet the criteria for more than one Funding Stream, the Funding Stream that should be prioritised is as follows:



CSD: Disadvantaged Student

CSE: Emergency

SLP: School Leavers Program

TSB: Targeted Skills for Small Business

CSR: Regional or Remote Students

Note:

- 1. All evidence must be able to be verified by SGSCC English. At the Department's discretion, the Department may request a copy of the evidence or proof that the evidence has been sighted.
- Where evidence is sighted but not kept, a record that confirms sighting of the evidence and a
 description of the evidence, must be maintained by SGSCC English. The record must be dated
 and signed by a person authorised by SGSCC English. The name of the signatory and their
 position should be captured.
- 3. Where the evidence provided by the student is a copy of the original, the copy must be certified by a person who is on the list of approved witnesses who can verify document. A list of which is available at the Commonwealth Attorney General's Department website at: www.ag.gov.au/Publications/Pages/Statutorydeclarationsignatorylist.aspx.
- 4. If a student declares their status in relation to identify as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person at a point in time after enrolment, SGSCC English must sight or collect the relevant evidence within 28 days of being notified by the student.

Students who are inmates with NSW Corrective Services

Students who are inmates in NSW correctional facilities do not have access to many of the documents required to allow SGSCC English to assess eligibility for Funded Training.

NSW Corrective Services records information in the Offender integrated Management System (OIMS) which can verify:

- Eligibility for Funded Training:
 - Living or working in NSW
 - Citizenship: Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen and permanent Australian resident
 - Humanitarian visa holder (Refugee or asylum seeker)

SGSCC English must make arrangements with the correctional facility on how information to support eligibility will be accessed/sighted. The sighting of information recorded on OIMS is deemed as sufficient evidence, however must be recorded by SGSCC English as per note 2 above.

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Refugees and asylum seekers

1. Refugees and asylum seekers who hold particular visas are eligible for Funded Training. A student who holds one of the below humanitarian visas are eligible for Funded Training.

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- 2. For a Bridging Visa to be eligible under the ACE Program, the bridging visa must be attached to an application for a humanitarian visa eligible for the ACE Program as listed above. The student must provide a document from the Department of Immigration and Border Protection acknowledging application for a humanitarian visa.
- 3. A person who holds a Partner (Provisional and Migrant) visa (subclass 309 100) and Partner visa (subclass 820 801) must also provide evidence that their sponsor holds or held one of the humanitarian visas outlined above.

As visa types and categories are subject to change, SGSCC English are encouraged to refer to additional materials produced by the Department on this matter.

*Staff Declaration: Only to be used where other evidence is not possible. A Staff Declaration is a declaration from an employee of SGSCC English confirming, based on information provided by the student or from other sources, the student meets the CSD Criteria specified. The employee must be authorised by the SGSCC to make any Staff Declarations. The SGSCC English must follow any other guidance provided by the Department about Staff Declarations.

CSR: A student is eligible for the CSR Funding Stream if the student:

- (a) does not meet any CSD Criteria; AND
- (b) lives or works in a Regional or Remote Location (that is, is any location that is not classified as "Major Cities (RA1)" on the following website: http://doctorconnect.gov.au/internet/otd/Pu blishing.nsf/Content/locator, or as otherwise advised by the Department.
- Proof of address (e.g. driver's license, utility bill, electoral roll or employment contract)

TSB: A student is eligible for the TSB Funding Stream if the student:

- (a) does not meet any CSD Criteria; AND
- (b) is either:
 - owner of a small business; OR
 - employee of a small business or not-forprofit organisation.

A **small business** is an enterprise with: less than 20 full time equivalent (**FTE**) employees; or, less than 200 FTE employees if the enterprise's primary operations is in a Regional or Remote Location (as defined above in CSR).

- if the student is an employee letter from the employer confirming employment and that the employer meets the definition of a small business or is a not-for-profit.
- if the student is the owner of a small business – statement from student confirming the business meets the definition of a small business

SLP: A student is eligible for the SLP Funding Stream if the student:

- Does not meet any CSD Criteria; AND
- Aged under 24 years

- Identity Evidence:
 - photographic identification (e.g. passport or driver's licence)
 - Letter or statement from a referring agency confirming the identity of the student; or

CSE: A student is eligible for the CSE Funding Stream if the student meets the criteria identified in the approved CSE Application.
